ABSENCES:

It is important that parents advise the school, on or before, the first day of a child's absence. You can telephone, text, email, or use the website absence form to let us know your child will be absent.

After the electronic morning roll call, the school office will text a caregiver of any child not accounted for.

Where a pattern of absences causes concern and there is no satisfactory explanation, home visits may be made or the Truancy Service contacted.

ACCIDENTS AT SCHOOL – HEALTH CARE:

Minor injuries and concerns are dealt with at school. In the case of more serious accidents, the school will attempt to contact a caregiver or the emergency contact person before any action is taken. If necessary, we will take children to the emergency clinic.

A note is sent home with your child if your child has had an accident that might need home follow up. If your child has had a significant incident, we will phone you to let you know what has happened.

Please let us know about any allergies and or medical conditions that may require treatment or support. Students are able to have labelled asthma inhalers or other regular medications safely stored in the school Health Centre.

AFTER AND BEFORE SCHOOL CARE: KIDS AFTER SCHOOL (KAS):



Kids After School is an after school care programme. The KAS base is at our school hall and operates from 3.00 to 6.00 pm. They also offer before school care from 6.30 to 8.30 am. Holiday programmes are also

COMPLAINTS:

We work hard to create the best learning environment possible. However, we also acknowledge that mistakes can be made. Therefore, we have a clear process if you have a complaint. DENTAL TREATMENT:

A mobile clinic visits school, usually for an initial check up. Children go to the clinic at Pukekohe Intermediate. The Intermediate clinic phone number is (09) 237 1070.

DOJO:

Once your child starts school you will receive an invitation via your email to join Class Dojo. This is a communication portal for school and home. The class teacher can send messages around events, have direct messages with just your family, or whole class conversations. They can also share your child's learning through this portal. School wide notices and the newsletters etc are also posted on Dojo.

ENROLLING PUPILS:

Children can officially start on their fifth birthday but should be pre-enrolled before this date. If you have a child turning 5 within the next 6 months, please go online and complete an online enrolment form on our website. We will then be in contact to arrange an enrolment meeting 6-8 weeks before their birthday.


Usually, children have four morning visits before their fifth birthday to help them settle in, these take place on Mondays and Fridays.

Visits to the new entrant classes are from 8.55 am to 12.30 pm.



ENROLMENT SCHEME:

The Board of Trustees has an enrolment scheme to help manage roll numbers. Details of the Enrolment Scheme are on our website. Children living within the school's geographical zone have automatic right of enrolment.

If your child is late to school, you must sign them in using the Vistab tablet in the school office. Students will be given a late sticker to give to their teacher.

If you need to collect your child during school hours, please Dojo your child's teacher and let the office know in advance. When arriving to collect your child, please come to the office and sign them out on the Vistab tablet and we will call them to the office.

LIBRARY:

All children are encouraged to borrow books from the school library for recreational and study purposes. It is preferred that some protective covering eg. a book bag, be used by children taking books home. Books are very expensive and a charge is made when books are lost or damaged.

All classes are timetabled for at least one library visit each week. The library system is computerised and books are on loan for one week for Y0 – 2 children and two weeks for Y3 – 6 children.

LOST PROPERTY:

There is a large lost property box in the senior courtyard. You are welcome to come and look through lost property for missing items. Please name all items so that they can be returned to their owners.

LUNCHES:

A lunch ordering system is operated from school by The Lunchbox, a private provider on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Lunch may be ordered from the classroom before 9.00 am, or Online through our Kindo Shop until 7.30am on the day. Orders can also be made in advance through Kindo. Current Menu is on our Website.

- Money should be in an envelope with the child's name, classroom and order written clearly on it. The correct money enclosed please so that change is not required.
- Current lunch price lists are available on the school website.
- Children eat outdoors if it is fine, otherwise indoors. They are expected to finish their lunch before going to play.
- Sweets are not encouraged, and chewing gum is forbidden. For safety's sake, glass bottles and cans of drink are not permitted.
- Please note that on PTA Sausage Sizzle days, The Lunchbox is closed.

MUSIC TUTORING:

The school has a partnership with the Modern School of Music who currently provide private music lessons in keyboard and guitar during school hours. Contact the school for tutor names and contact numbers, or look on our website for the latest information.

NEWSLETTERS:

Family Newsletters are emailed to parents and published weekly on the school website and Facebook page, usually on a Friday. As well as giving information, the newsletter is an important way for the school to communicate its needs and successes.

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION/BIBLE IN SCHOOLS:

A bible in schools programme is provided for all classes each Wednesday morning from 9.00 to 9.30 am for those students that opt into this programme. The programme is based on bible stories and commonly held values. Those students not involved in this programme remain in class where they will focus on our school values.

REPORTS AND INTERVIEWS:

The current reporting to parents and interview arrangements are as follows:

- Parents of all our students are invited to a whanau evenings early in Term 1.
- A written report is provided at mid year and end of year/
- Parents are invited to family conferences at mid year with students also attending.
- Parents and caregivers are also welcome to arrange meetings with teachers, Deputy Principal or Principal

ROAD PATROLS:

There is a road patrol crossing opposite the school entrance on Ward Street and a "Kea" crossing on Green Lane. Road patrol children are trained and are supervised by a parent or teacher each morning from 8.30 to 8.55 a.m. and after school from 3.00 p.m. to about 3.15 p.m.

For their safety, children must use the crossing when moving over Ward Street and Green Lane. Parental support in role modelling the use of the crossings with their children to keep safe is really appreciated.

SCHOOL DONATIONS:

Hill School has opted into the government's new funding scheme, so we are not asking any families for School Donations.

SPORTING

All children participate in PE, Athletics, and Cross Country.

Middle and Senior students also have the opportunity to represent

Pukekohe Hill School in various tournaments. Students will be invited to
sign up for these tournaments throughout the year, competing in sports
such as football, swimming, gymnastics, rugby, and cricket against other
local schools.

STATIONERY:

SUN SAFETY:

In Terms 1, & 4 there is a "no hat no play" rule to encourage good sunsense habits. Children without uniform hats at lunchtime can use the shaded areas of the main bank near the adventure playground. Children are able to bring their own sunscreen and sunshades.

SWIMMING:

Swimming and Water Safety are a required part of the school programme. Children should bring their swimming togs every day their class is timetabled for swimming. We would appreciate, and will respect, notification of health reasons which may exclude children from swimming. Some groups of students are also funded to undertake swimming lessons at other Pukekohe pools

UNIFORMS:

Pukekohe Hill has a compulsory uniform. It is essential that all uniform items are clearly named so they can be returned to their owner if lost. Unnamed uniform items are held during each term and then put into the second hand stock that is for sale at the school office. Uniforms are available at the Warehouse Pukekohe.
